CRAFT GINS

The craft gin revolution in particular has spread beyond its traditional heartland of London to permeate far flung corners of the UK. The growth of small traditional distillers has fuelled a renewed interest in this quintessentially English tippie. Most of the gin sold in the UK is made on an industrial scale by three big distilleries in England. Craft gins are made in smaller batches and often in traditional pot stills that have a smaller capacity with carefully selected ingredients.

TONIC WATERS

The drink gained its name from the medicinal effects of its bitter flavouring. The quinine was added to the drink as a prophylactic against malaria, since it was originally intended for consumption in tropical areas of South Asia where the disease is endemic. Quinine powder was so bitter that British officers stationed in 19th Century India began mixing the powder with soda and sugar and a basic tonic water was created.

CRAFT VODKA

Craft vodka is largely made in smaller batches by independent distillers. The entire process is carried out on site using ingredients that have been carefully selected to create a different flavour and style. Usually these products are innovative and unique such as The Lakes Vodka which is distilled using the purest locally sourced water from the River Derwent.

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COGNAC

Cognac is named after the town of Cognac in France. It is produced in the wine growing region surrounding the town from which it takes its name. For Brandy to bear the name Cognac, an Appellation d'origine contrôlée, its production methods must meet certain legal requirements. In particular, it must be made from specified grapes of which Saint-Emilion is the most widely used. The brandy must be twice distilled and aged for at least two years in French oak barrels from Limousin or Trancais. Cognac matures the same way as whisky's and wine, most Cognacs are aged considerably longer than the legal requirement.

ARMAGNAC

Armagnac is a distinctive type of Brandy distilled in the Armagnac region in Gascony, southwest France. Armagnac was one of the first areas of France to begin distilling spirits, but the overall volume of production is far smaller than Cognac therefore is less well known outside Europe. In addition, they for the most part are made and sold by small producers, whereas Cognac production is dominated by big-name brands.

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THE HISTORY OF BLENDED WHISKY

Scotch whisky evolved from a Scottish drink called usiga beatha, which means water of life. The earliest record of distillation in Scotland occurred as long ago as 1494 as documented in the Exchequer Rolls, which were the record of royal income and expenditure. Whisky production was first taxed in 1644 causing a rise in illicit whisky distilling in the country. Around 1780 there were about eight legal distilleries and 400 illegal ones. The term blend is used specifically for whisky that is made with spirits from several single malt distilleries. Blended whisky constitutes about 90% of all whisky Produced in Scotland.

SINGLE MALT WHISKY

Single malt whisky is the term used for whiskies that are produced from one single distillery. The distiller will ensure each batch is produced to a specific standard before being transferred to casks for maturation. Each distillery has its own unique methods. The difference in flavour, aroma and style is heavily influenced by what is absorbed from the atmosphere, the water source and the sherry or bourbon casks that each whisky is matured in. Each cask gives its own unique flavour to the whisky.

LOWLAND

Lowland areas of Scotland include the Borders and areas surrounding Glasgow and Edinburgh. Some of the lowland malts are triple distilled giving them a lighter more delicate flavour.

With an abundance of fast flowing rivers and outstanding water purity, the region is home to some of Scotland's best loved single malt whiskies and many of the country's famous blends.

ISLAY

Islay malts have a distinct flavour which comes from barley smoked over peat and atmospheric influences from the islands coastal location. Islay is just off the west Highland coast in the inner Hebrides. It has a surprising number of long established distilleries and is one of Scotland's whisky tourism centres.

BOURBON

The origins of bourbon whiskey is often disputed but it is generally accepted that the name is either derived from Bourbon state in Kentucky or Bourbon Street in New Orleans. It is thought that the distillation of the spirit was established by Scottish and Irish settlers in the late 18th century. Today the US stipulates that Bourbon must be produced in the United States, is made from grain containing at least 51% corn, is aged in new, charred oak barrels, is distilled to no more than 80% abv, is entered into the barrel for aging at no more than 62.5% abv and is bottled at 40% abv or above. It is estimated that 95% of all Bourbon is produced in Kentucky. Almost 5 million barrels are currently aging in the US exceeding the entire state population of Kentucky. Tennessee is also a major producer.

RUM

Made from the fermented juice of sugar cane, rum became popular and widely available in the 17th Century. As well as being strategically important, the islands of the West Indies had an abundance of sugar plantations and rum became a staple drink for sailors. The association of rum with the British Navy began in 1655 when Jamaica was captured by the fleet. The rum ration was issued to all British sailors for 315 years until it was finally abolished on July 31st 1970.

PORT

The wine producing region of Douro is the third oldest protected wine region in the world after Tokaj-Hegyalia region in Hungary, established in 1730 and Chianti, in 1716. Contrary to popular belief, Port was not created by British sailors by spiking the wine with brandy to avoid spoilage during the long voyage North. More accurately, British importers could be credited for recognising that a smooth already fortified wine would appeal to British palates and would survive the trip to London. In 1678, a Liverpool merchant sent two representatives to Viana do Castelo, north of Oporto to learn the wine trade. While on vacation in the Douro, the two gentlemen visited the Abbot of Lamego who treated them to a “very agreeable, sweetish and extremely smooth wine” which had been fortified with a distilled spirit. The Englishmen were so pleased with the product they purchased the Abbots entire lot and shipped it home.

SHERRY

Enjoying a recent revival in popularity, Sherry is the British term for the Spanish fortified wine Jerez. It became widely available after Sir Francis Drake requisitioned 2900 barrels from the Port of Cadiz in 1587. Much of the Spanish fleet was destroyed whilst they prepared for the Armada. By the end of the 16th Century, Jerez was regarded as the finest wine in Europe.

VERMOUTHS & APERITIFS

Vermouth is an aromatized wine, a type of fortified wine flavoured with various botanicals. The modern version of the beverage was first produced mid to late 18th century in Turin, Italy. While Vermouth was traditionally used for medicinal purposes, its true claim to fame is as an aperitif. An aperitif is an alcoholic beverage usually served before the meal to stimulate the appetite and is therefore usually dry rather than sweet.

LIQUEURS

Liqueurs are historical descendants of herbal medicines, they were made in Italy as early as the 13th century and were often prepared by monks, such as Chartreuse. A liqueur is a distilled spirit that has been flavoured with fruit, cream, herbs, spices, flowers or nuts and bottled with added sugar or other sweetener such as high-fructose corn syrup. Liqueurs are typically sweet and are usually not aged for long after the ingredients have been mixed, but may have resting periods during their production to allow the flavours to marry.
